- Campus Police vehicle (Expedition);
- Dental reception area of Mayme Green Allied Health Center, Room 100;
- Entrance to Room 139, Business Office in Haverty Hall;
- Entrance to Room 112, Computer Center in Old Main; and
- Lobby of Stern Cultural Center.

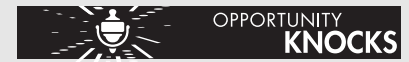
