WAHPETON — The North Dakota State College of Science has awarded \$1,000 scholarships to 87 students from five states.

The scholarships recognize and reward students for academic achievement and test scores and participation in extracurricular and volunteer activities. The \$1,000 scholarships are applicable during the 2004-05 academic year.
