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ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Enrollment Services welcomes your questions about application procedures. We can arrange campus tours and appointments with instructors in your area of interest. If you are applying electronically, please submit a \$35 application fee electronically or via mail, to the NDSCS Enrollment Service office. This will expedite your acceptance.

ITEMS YOU WILL NEED TO COMPLETE THE ADMISSION APPLICATION PROCESS:

- Completed application for admission; \$35 application fee
- High school transcript or GED
- Official college transcript or GED
- The North Dakota University System requires: (a) proof of immunizations for measles, rubella and mumps, (b) ACT or SAT score for applicants under 25

NORTH DAKOTA RESIDENCY

Students qualifying for North Dakota residency status must meet one of the two following criteria:

- A person whose custodial parent, guardian or parents has been a legal resident of North Dakota for 12 months immediately prior to the beginning of the academic term;
- A person age 18 or older who has been a legal resident of North Dakota for 12 months immediately prior to the beginning of the academic term.

ACCEPTANCE

Early application is advised for the program of your choice, as many programs have limited enrollment. Applicants who meet the entrance requirements are accepted in the program of their choice as soon as the completed application form and \$35 application fee are received.

To secure your enrollment in your selected program, you need to register for classes on scheduled registration days/dates. Class schedules are generated on a first-come, first-served basis regardless of application date.

SELECTIVE ENROLLMENT PROGRAMS

Students interested in Caterpillar Service Technician, Dental Assisting, Dental Hygiene, John Deere Tech, Associate in Science in Nursing and Practical Nursing are required to submit additional supporting credentials and meet application deadlines. Contact Enrollment Services for application requirements. (Do not send housing application and housing deposit until you are accepted.)

OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS

Official transcripts are complete records of your educational background and must be sent to Enrollment Services directly from the high school and/or college(s) you have attended. Transcripts must be signed by a school/college official and stamped with the official school/college seal. Photocopies/faxes of transcripts from the school/college attended are not considered official. The request for a transcript must be from you.

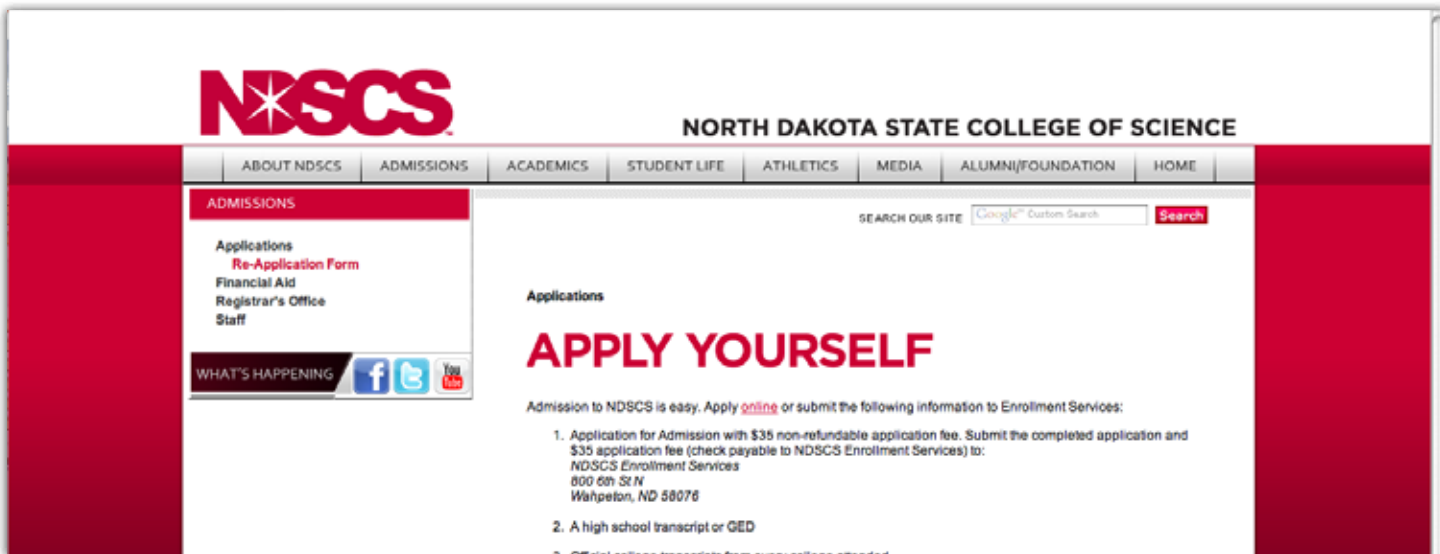

**The most common arrangement is a double room \$1,858 with a block of 160 meals each semester \$2,566 totaling \$4,424. However, the above figure of \$5,926 is a single room \$2,588, with a block of 300 meals each semester \$3,338. Other available dining plans include a block of 80 meals each semester \$1,390 or a block of 225 meals per semester \$2,666. All rates are for two semesters.

FINANCIAL AID GENERAL INFORMATION

About 92 percent of the students attending the North Dakota State College of Science receive financial aid to help cover education costs. This assistance is provided in the form of grants, scholarships, loans and work-study opportunities. When it comes to financing your education, the primary responsibility lies with you and/or your family. The assistance from financial aid is intended to supplement the financial support that you and/or your family can provide.

Many types of financial aid are based upon demonstrated financial need. A standard formula called “Federal Needs Analysis Methodology,” or FM, is used to determine financial aid eligibility for all applicants. Factors such as income, assets/debts, family size and number in college are considered in the formula.

FINANCIAL AID PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

Program descriptions of the various types of assistance available at NDSCS are included on our website, ndscs.edu.

WHEN TO APPLY

It is to your advantage to complete a free application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) early. Paper and electronic versions, found at www.fafsa.ed.gov, are available. The priority deadline at the North Dakota State College of Science is **April 15**. To ensure that your FAFSA is processed by the April 15 priority deadline, it is suggested paper FAFSA's be mailed by **March 15** and electronic FAFSA's be submitted by **April 1**.

Financial aid applications at NDSCS are processed as they become complete. If your application is processed by April 15, your eligibility to receive funding from the following funds will be determined: Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG), Federal Perkins Loan and Federal Work Study.

You will receive a Student Aid Report (SAR) about four weeks after you submit your FAFSA. Carefully read the information in the report and immediately send any corrections to the NDSCS Financial Aid office. **NOTE:** The deadline for submitting a valid SAR to the college is the student's last day of attendance or June 30, whichever is first.

Each year the federal government randomly selects aid applicants to undergo a process called “verification.” If selected, you will be requested to submit a photocopy of your federal income tax return, your parents' (or spouse's) tax return – if applicable – in addition to other supporting documentation. If you did not keep a copy of your 2011 federal tax return or are unable to locate a copy, you should contact the IRS at 1-800-829-1040 to request a tax account listing. The verification process must be completed before you will be considered for or receive financial aid.

INSTITUTIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships at NDSCS are sponsored by contributions from friends, alumni and the business community. To apply for a scholarship, complete the enclosed Scholarship Application by the February 1 deadline. Applications received after February 1 will be reviewed only if scholarship funds are still available.

HOW FINANCIAL AID IS AWARDED

Eligibility for most types of financial aid is based upon financial need. Your financial need is the difference between the cost of attendance at NDSCS and the amount you and/or your family are expected to contribute toward your education, as determined by the Department of Education.

In the awarding process, you will be considered first for all grant aid. This includes the Federal Pell Grant, North Dakota State Grant and Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG). The FSEOG goes to the neediest students who have met the April 15 priority deadline date and who are eligible for the Pell Grant.

Scholarships from either NDSCS or other sources are added to the financial aid package as they are reported to NDSCS. This funding may reduce your eligibility for loans, work-study or grants, usually in that order. Scholarships do not affect the Federal Pell Grant or the North Dakota State Grant.

After considering all grant and scholarship eligibility, work-study eligibility will be determined. **Funding is limited and usually goes to students who meet the April 15 priority deadline.** If you are interested in working, be sure to check the work-study box on the FAFSA or Renewal Application.

Loans are added to the financial aid package last to help meet any remaining need. The student's eligibility for Federal Perkins and/or Direct Subsidized Stafford loans is considered first; eligibility for Direct Unsubsidized Stafford loan programs will be considered second.

All Federal Direct Stafford loan recipients must complete an entrance loan counseling session and master promissory note before loan funds will be disbursed. This can be done online at www.studentloans.gov.

Additional alternative loan programs, such as the Federal Direct PLUS, Minnesota SELF, Bank of North Dakota DEAL, Wells Fargo Student Loan for Career and Community Colleges, and Madge Vertin are available by separate application. These loans may require a credit analysis or co-signer, and that interest be paid while the student attends college.

During the month of June, the student will be notified of their Financial Aid Award from the NDSCS Financial Aid office. The student may accept or reject any of the aid offered. The Financial Aid Award will be based upon full-time enrollment (12 or more credits).

Note: If you apply for financial aid after July 15, you may not have aid available when school begins in August and must be prepared to pay college expenses from your own resources.

If you and/or your family are not able to provide the expected family contribution, alternative loan programs are available and application should be made as soon as possible to ensure the funds are available in time for payment of the necessary college expenses.

CULTURAL DIVERSITY TUITION WAIVER APPLICATION PROCEDURES

Recognizing the educational benefit of a culturally diverse student population, NDSCS administers a tuition waiver program. Cultural Diversity Waivers are intended to encourage enrollment of a culturally diverse student body for the benefit of all students and the academic community. **(International students do not qualify for this program.)**

ELIGIBILITY

Applicant must meet one of the following definitions for eligibility under this program:

A. Enrolled members of federally-recognized American Indian Tribes, and Alaska Natives and Villages as defined pursuant to the Alaskan Native Claims Settlement Act. Special emphasis will be given to enrolled members of the Spirit Lake Sioux Tribe, Three Affiliated Tribes, Turtle Mountain Band of Chippewa and Standing Rock Sioux Tribe and transfers from North Dakota tribal colleges.

B. Members of a culturally diverse group, who are defined as historically under represented (Hispanic/Latino, American Indian, Alaska Native, Asian, Black or African American and Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander) persons of different cultural, racial, or ethnic heritage.

C. Persons who are defined as economically disadvantaged.

ACADEMIC CONSIDERATIONS

Waiver recipients must maintain a minimum grade-point average of 2.0. Recipients must be enrolled full-time.

AMOUNT OF WAIVERS/DURATION

Waivers in the amount of \$800 will be awarded for one academic year. Students must re-apply each year for consideration, with a limit of four semesters as a recipient.

HOW TO APPLY

Complete a Cultural Diversity Tuition Waiver Application (on the page at right) with all verifications, personal statements, transcripts and any other pertinent information. Top consideration is given to those meeting the April 15 deadline. Complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) application before April 15 using NDSCS code 002996.

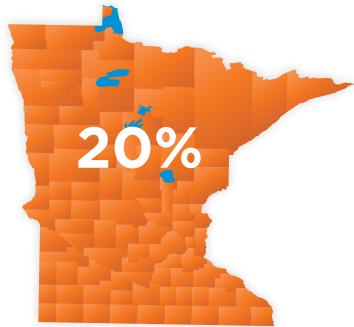

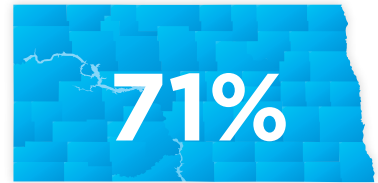

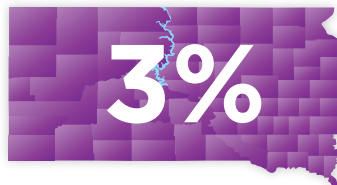
STUDENTS FROM MINNESOTA

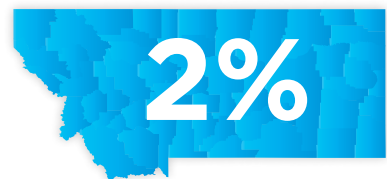
